Check Out New Homecoming Parade Route & Community Pep Rally Info

The Pascagoula High homecoming parade is set for 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Oct. 26, 2017. Beach Elementary Principal Shirley Hunter will serve as grand marshal. Line-up will be from 4:30-5:15 p.m. The check-in station will be at the corner of Tucker Avenue and 11th Street. The parade will begin at the PHS gym on Taylor Street, traveling to Polk and then north on Market Street, west on Jackson Avenue, south on Pascagoula Street, continuing to the corner of Dupont and

Pascagoula Streets where it will end.

The parade will finish with a community pep rally/block party on Delmas Avenue between Pascagoula Street and Magnolia Street. The party will be from 6:45-9 p.m. The party will feature a pep rally near the fountain next to Paradise Grill, bouncy houses in the empty lot next to Scranton's, free face painting and spirit items.
